7 (a) In General.—Section 236 of the Immigration

This Act may be cited as the "Fairness and Access

- 9 ing at the end the following:

1 "(g) Constituent Services.—

"(1) Request to determine center.—Not later than 90 days after the date of enactment of this subsection, any individual detained pursuant to the authority under this section, or any other provision in this Act, shall have access to the Department's Privacy Waiver Authorizing Disclosure to a Third Party, ICE Form 60–001, or any successor form, as well as a Congressional Privacy Release Form upon written request, including in the language spoken by the detainee, of the detainee to the detention center.

"(2) Notice to detained.—Not later than 24 hours after arriving at the facility, the detention center shall provide to each detained alien the ICE National Detainee Handbook, along with the handbook from the specific facility they are being held. The Handbook should be available in the language spoken by the detainee. If not available in such language, any information in the handbook must be orally interpreted for the detainee through a professional interpreter, at the request of the detainee. The National Detainee Handbook shall have a section titled 'Congressional Constituent Services' with information on the availability of constituent serv-

1 ices, the ability to access the Law Library at the fa-2 cility to access a Department's Privacy Waiver Au-3 thorizing Disclosure to a Third Party, ICE Form 4 60–001, or any successor form, Congressional Pri-5 vacy Release Form, how to send it to their Member 6 of Congress or a third-party individual assisting with 7 their case, and the process described in paragraph 8 (5) for filing a complaint for failure to receive such 9 services. "(3) Notice to congressional office.—Not 10 11 later than 7 days after a request is submitted pursu-12 ant to paragraph (1), an employee of the detention 13 center in which the detainee is detained shall elec-14 tronically submit a written notice to the congres-15 sional office that a detainee is seeking to receive 16 constituent services as well as a copy of a Privacy 17 Release from the appropriate congressional office. 18 "(4) Printing, copying, and correspond-19 ENCE.—A detention center shall permit a detainee 20 to access a computer, email, printing, and copying 21 privileges, along with writing implements and paper 22 to facilitate continued communication with their con-23 gressional office or other third-party individuals as-24 sisting with their case throughout the casework

1	"(5) Enforcement.—
2	"(A) IN GENERAL.—If a detention center
3	fails to provide the detainee access to a Depart-
4	ment's Privacy Waiver Authorizing Disclosure
5	to a Third Party, ICE Form 60–001, or any
6	successor form, or the Congressional Privacy
7	Release form, within 30 days after requesting
8	it, or is found to be in violation of any provision
9	of this Act, a detainee, or third-party indi-
10	vidual—
11	"(i) may submit a complaint to the
12	detention center through such complaint or
13	grievance process as the detention center
14	may establish; or
15	"(ii) may bring a civil action against
16	the agency which engaged in that violation

20	"(B) Language.—A detention center shall
21	give a detainee access to an interpreter for the

1	"(6) Congressional office defined.—In
2	this subsection, the term 'congressional office' means
3	the congressional office for the congressional district
4	in which the last known residence of the detainee
5	was located, or the residence of the requesting third-
6	party.".
7	(b) REGULATIONS.—The Secretary of Homeland Se-
8	curity shall issue a rule implementing the amendment
9	made by subsection (a) not later than 180 days after the
10	date of enactment of this Act.
11	(c) Notice.—Not later than 270 days after the date
12	of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Homeland Secu-
13	rity shall submit written notice to each immigration deten-
14	tion center of the rules with respect to the ability to access
15	Congressional constituent services and the complaint proc-
16	ess for detainees.
17	(d) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
18	subsection (a) shall take effect 90 days after the date of

19 enactment of this Act.
